The Sevastopol School District and the New Boys & Girls Club announces the establishment of a new learning resource center to support remote learning for K-8th graders in the school district. The center will be located in the ballroom of the Institute Saloon, Boys & Girls Club CEO John McMahon announced today.

“COVID-19 has changed all of our lives with the biggest impact falling on how we teach, learn and deliver education and support in order to ensure our students succeed academically,” said McMahon. “This new learning center will provide support for over 100 students and parents who are finding themselves in need of additional resources and it is a key component of our mission to support Academic Success in our community.”

The new learning support center will:

Provide a coordinated approach to ensure all students have access to additional resources on the days they are not assigned their traditional classroom;

Support students with a remote learning support team consisting of Boys & Girls staff along with a Youth Apprentice and support volunteers;

Support students and family’s adjustment to the academic schedule and expanding their support access;

Assist in ensuring the outcome of remote learning is effective and high-quality through monitoring, reporting, training and collaboration

“Sevastopol School District is beyond excited and thankful for this collaborative opportunity. Sevastopol remains dedicated to finding alternative paths to support our students and families. With the New Boys and Girls Club partnership, we can continue to take care of one another especially during these challenging times”, Melissa Marggraf, Director of Pupil Services said.
